

Owner's Story

PRINCESS 35 M M/Y Restless





What's your boating history?

I started out on sail boats as a child and then would crew for friends' parents' boats at the weekends in the Solent. Then I got married and started a family fairly young so there was a significant break, but once the children had grown-up, we started yachting again, and switched from sail to motor in their teenage years (5 girls enough said!).

We purchased our first motor yacht in 2015, a Fairline Squadron 58, a perfect first boat to get started on. We then moved to a 72ft Princess for more room in 2018 and started to engage full time crew with our existing Captain Jolan Pedersen. We were having so much fun we decided to step up again to the Princess 88 in 2019 and then took a big leap to the Princess 35M in 2021.

Why did you choose Princess?

A dear friend of mine called Neville, who is a mad keen boater and already owned a Princess V Class in Chichester, kindly invited us on his boat and we'd regularly visit the boat show and compare different brands and models. I simply didn't see any other manufacturer apart from older Fairlines and one or two Italian builders matching the build quality of Princess. They are just a higher-grade product, intelligently built to a high standard.

Why did you select the Princess 35M?

In truth we were more focused on something in the 30m range moving up from an 88-footer (23m) and proving that Princess' sales people are as good as their boats, Joe Hill persuaded Di and I to visit the boat in Italy to at least 'have a look'. Well, it was all over from the moment we set foot on her. This gave us so much more room including an extra berth and a proper 'garage' and the boat was in superb condition. It was a stretch for us, but we negotiated during another lockdown and ended up with an agreement in May 2021.

How has it performed?

It's been the most wonderful experience. So far, no major technical issues and Princess have been very solid in supporting all warranty work on the inevitable issues that arise in the first few years. We now have a full-time engineer who often remarks on the high-quality build and thought put into the engineering and ability to easily maintain the boat.

What have been some of your recent yachting highlights?

There are so many it's going to be difficult to pinpoint. We spent our first few years in the Balearics on all of our boats. There is something for everyone in the islands from the absolute peace and serenity of Cabrera to the night life of Ibiza and the beauty and calm of Mallorca's west coast. However, in truth it's always been about the journey so having explored these islands we have started our exploration up through the Spanish and French coast, Sardinia and Corsica and now back down the Italian coast to Amalfi in 2023.

What are your cruising plans for the future?

Our plan has always been to travel the Mediterranean, but slowly and really explore different areas, so after a planned birthday moored in Venice, we will, over the next few years be travelling down through the Croatian archipelago, doodle around Corfu and Lefkada, through the Gulf of Corinth and into the Aegean Sea. We are starting to think of a couple of seasons in the Caribbean as well to make the most of the year.









DESIGN


An illuminated Princess 'crown' logo on the transom guides guests aboard the electro-hydraulic teak-laid bathing platform where twin access steps border the large aft sun pad.

The cockpit features a unique sociable U-shaped seating area with modular seating, folding teak table and servery unit – the perfect place to entertain, or to sit back, relax, and enjoy the yacht's exhilarating performance. The cockpit bar connects to the galley unit to create an almost seamless transition from outside to in, with a glass window partition which folds up from the unit below to provide servery access when entertaining. Triple-sliding saloon doors create a harmonious connection from exterior to interior, which is accentuated with an elegant lighting design feature which flows from the outside headlining through to the main saloon.



The saloon is designed for sociable living. It offers a large L-shaped dining area opposite the fully equipped galley, which then leads to a cavernous main deck saloon. Inside the saloon, there is a U-shaped sofa and Princess Design Studio coffee table. There is also an elegant sideboard unit that contains a 55" UHD LED TV on rise and fall. Two bespoke Princess helm seats are positioned for optimum visibility and control, plus companion seating and fold out table. There is a pantograph helmsman's door and a large opening roof that can reveal the main deck to the elements. Systems are accessed through an integrated Böning vessel monitoring system while, for entertainment, a Naim audio system is installed throughout the saloon, master stateroom and sportbridge.

Below deck, eight guests enjoy four beautifully appointed en-suite cabins, all bathed in natural light from elegant hull glazing, with a further twin cabin aft for occasional guests or crew. A dedicated staircase leads from the main deck to the full-beam owner's stateroom amidships, via a private lobby area in the lower companionway.





On the upper deck, the S72's sportbridge invites outdoor living with a large U-shaped dining area, wet bar with barbecue and L-shaped seating forward that transforms to a sunbed. Forward on the main deck, the spacious foredeck boasts innovative sunbeds with integrated adjustable headrests, which can be converted to create additional aft-facing seats, whilst a locker between the sunbeds can be specified as an additional cool box.

The stern houses a generous garage with electro-hydraulic door and integrated launch system that comfortably accommodates a 3.9m tender creating the perfect base for watersports. Storage for two SEABOB's is provided in an innovative locker within the garage door, while a separate transom door gives direct access to the twin-berth crew cabin from the electro-hydraulic bathing platform.



Cannes Yachting Festival

Cannes, the beautiful Cote d'Azure, emulating romance and glamour, once again set the perfect scene for Europe's largest in-water boat show, welcoming 54,000 visitors to its 45th anniversary event. Visitors experienced the World Premiere of the Princess V50 Open, along with the Princess X95, Y85, S78, S66, S62, V55 and V40.

Southampton International Boat Show

16th – 25th September 2022

Heralded a fantastic success, British Marine welcomed 83,000 visitors to its 53rd show spanning a 70,000 square metre footprint. A week in the life of a Charter Captain

The recent reality TV show 'Below Deck' has caused quite a stir; a fly-on-the-wall show following a superyacht crew at work on charter. We caught up with Captain Antonio onboard our Princess Yacht Charter M/Y Lemon Not Lime to find out what it's really like to be a Yacht Charter Captain. Currently at anchor in Palma Nova, Mallorca in the beautiful Balearics and on charter with four guests – Captain Antonio had just finished assisting the Chef with loading fresh provisions on board...





How long have you been a Yacht Captain?

'I've been a Captain for 14 years and was previously a Marine in the Spanish Marine Corps that took me all over the world, including being deployed to Bosnia. I started my training to become a yacht captain with the RYA 'Day Skipper' qualification. I then started working for a small charter company and went on to gain my 'Yacht Masters' qualification, and 6 years ago I got my 'big ticket' with the Spanish Merchant Navy – the Master 1600gt and Officer of the Watch Unlimited. I've worked for Princess Motor Yacht Sales since last April but I've previously captained many different Princess yachts.'

Tell us about your charter yacht M/Y Lemon Not Lime?

'She's a 2018 Princess 75ft motor yacht. I've worked on board Princess yachts

throughout my career and they are lovely boats. We are based in Palma, Mallorca, and cover the Balearics including Ibiza, Mallorca, Formentera and Menorca which offers great diversity for cruising. She is perfect for families or groups of friends as she has 4 guest cabins sleeping 8. We have a Williams 395 tender on board which is awesome for wakeboarding, water skiing and towing toys - for those seeking adrenalin-filled watersports. We also have Seabobs, snorkelling gear, 2 inflatable paddle boards, and fishing equipment.'

How do you prepare for a charter?

'I receive a preference list from the Princess Yacht Charter office in Mayfair. It tells me everything I need to know about the lead guest and their family and friends joining us on board. When we learn about their likes and dislikes such as what they would like to see and do, which Balearic Islands they prefer, if they enjoy water toys and very importantly - the food, especially any allergies, it helps us create a bespoke yacht charter. Sometimes guests book a charter to celebrate a special occasion such as birthday or anniversary so we like to prepare something super special in advance.'

What happens when guests arrive?

'Our charter guests arrive at midday on the first day and we all get changed into our white uniform with epaulettes 'bars', ready to receive them. I do the introductions and give them a tour of the yacht from the cabins to the flybridge, a full security briefing and the do's and don'ts including how to use the heads 'toilets'! I also check if they can swim and if anyone suffers from seasickness. I run through the schedule with them - they would have already seen this in

advance based on their preferences - and check it against the latest weather forecast. Sometime I need to amend the itinerary slightly due to the weather. Sometimes it seems fine within the marina but outside it may not be suitable to do some of the things we had hoped and planned.'

Could you give me an example of a typical charter week itinerary?

'One of my favourite itineraries is cruising around my home island of Mallorca. Guests enjoy a different port every evening so they see a variety of stunning views and scenery. Depending on the guests' preferences, they often enjoy the variety of watersports available on board and I drive them to secluded coves and caves in the tender - it's great to experience unique spots that the big boats can't get to. I also run them over to the shore for restaurant or excursion bookings.'

What does your role involve when you're on charter?

'Well believe it or not, driving the boat is the small part of my overall role! I'm in command of the ship which carries huge responsibility and it's a very demanding job as the safety and well-being of the guests, crew and the boat are all on my shoulders. We have a Chef and a Stewardess but for this size of yacht we don't have a dedicated Engineer or Deckhand so I wear many hats. Yes, I drive the boat but I also take care of any technical issues such as engineering, electrics, generators, engines, bathing platforms, toilets and even keeping the

exterior of the yacht spotless. As I'm local to Mallorca and know the Balearic Islands very well, I can also provide recommendations of what to do like a guide and I make bookings such as restaurant reservations. It helps to be local and kind so that I can book berths for the yacht and table reservations that are extremely sought after! I have a lot of great contacts, which enables me to procure special food and wine too, and they deliver directly to the yacht if necessary. It's always best to have a local Captain with local knowledge and a powerful network of contacts.'

What hours do you work?

'You can't count the hours! Its 24/7. I work 7 months for the busy summer charter season and then 4 months in the winter with the Spanish Military commanding a platoon of up to 18 soldiers, and also training new recruits, with different exercises all over Spain, as a Staff Sergeant in the Spanish Army



Active Reserve. It's nice to have the variety. In the winter I live in my house in Mallorca but I'm always on call if I'm needed on board too.'

What happens on the last day of charter?

'We refuel with the guests still on board as that's all part of the APA (Advanced Provisioning Allowance) expenditure. And when we are back at the marina, I sit down with the lead guest and run through the excel spreadsheet of costs for things like fuel, excursions and

restaurants etc. I pride myself on taking good care of the APA by running the yacht efficiently especially when it comes to fuel. We say our 'goodbyes' and as soon as the guests leave the boat, we start a thorough clean of the entire yacht from cabins to galley and water toys to the exterior. Sometimes we only have 24 hours to prepare for the next charter so we employ dayworkers as there is too much to do for 3 people.'

Can you tell us the best and most tricky part of your job?

'It's sometimes a lot to handle, especially having a variety of roles on board to juggle that the guests don't see. You have to remain calm, resolve any unforeseen adjustments to the itinerary or attend to technical issues behind the scenes whilst still being super happy and full of energy in front of guests even though you may feel a little tired at times. But I love how rewarding it is when the guests are having a fantastic time and they really appreciate what we do for them. You build a nice connection with them and at the end of the charter they tell you how happy they are. When they've had a great time and everyone is back on the dock safe and sound, and they've given fantastic feedback to the office or the owner, it's a very special feeling of pride and reward. And I really like it when they occasionally send me a message. We have a lot of loyal clients who come back time after time, and they often tend to like to do the same trip – circumnavigate the island of Mallorca in 7 days!'

What is most difficult about your job?

'The boat is my life. Its 24/7, even when I'm asleep, I'm listening for the engine and the generators and all the other odd sounds. It's all part of the responsibility of the boat, the guests and the crew. And while I'm working the charter season I can't plan or partake in my personal life such as attending special occasions with family and friends like birthdays and weddings.'



What do you love most about your job as a Yacht Captain?

'Making people happy. I'm part of the best moments of people's holidays. Guests remember me for my energy and helping them have an amazing time. After the charter, they message me now and then, send me photos and 'Merry Christmas' messages. Guests can sometimes be demanding but the positive feedback is incredibly rewarding. When you spend up to two weeks together you build friendship and trust. And as crew, we always go the extra mile – guests have my mobile number in case they need me while they are ashore too, they can call me anytime. 

'Well, there's a magic threshold in terms of the length of the yacht that keeps it in the 'pleasure vessel' category as opposed to 'commercial' status which brings great benefits. Its all about the load line length being under 24 metres. For example, the largest yacht in the new Princess fleet is the Princess X95 and she has a load line of 23.95 metres, keeping her just within the 'pleasure vessel' category. Princess has cleverly designed their new X Class and Y Class yachts, in collaboration with long-standing naval architects partner Olesinski and the prestigious Italian design house Pininfarina, to conform within the 24 metre load line regulation while maximising internal volume and deck space and the LOA (length overall).





In the open-plan single-level main deck saloon, for instance, there's a large aft lounge, a forward dining table and a port galley with an attractive bar. speeds of up to 31 knots and deliver a supremely quiet and refined cruise.





In the open-plan single-level main deck saloon, for instance, there's a large aft lounge, a forward dining table and a port galley with an attractive bar. There's also a handy day heads in the forward part of the saloon – but the main deck helm station is divided off from the main living space for outstanding privacy on long-distance cruises. And at the touch of a button, the galley can also be fully enclosed to help divide the utility spaces from the party zones.



That space is echoed up on the flybridge, where the helm, dining area, wet bar and sunbed are supplemented with a large aft deck with crane and tender storage, helping free up the lower swim platform for watersports. And in spite of the scale and calibre of her recreational spaces, the Y85 is an impressive performer too. With twin MAN V12-1900 diesels, she can reach speeds of up to 31 knots and deliver a supremely quiet and refined cruise.

All this main deck versatility means there's only one (rather than two) staircases to access the lower deck, but down below, there is ample space not just for four ensuite cabins but also for a class-leading separate crew quarters comprising two crew cabins and a crew mess.

Offering a generous beam, the new Y80 provides significant volume and flexibility with owners able to specify innovative alternative layouts to suit their needs.





Three cockpit designs are available: a traditional U-shaped dining arrangement with additional storage solution for two SEABOBs; a central cockpit table with free standing furniture to seat eight guests; or Princess' new 'infinity cockpit' layout (first seen on the new Princess Y85) with electrically sliding seating and table mechanism to transform the area from a relaxed sofa arrangement to an informal dining area.

There is a seamless connection of each zone on the main deck, from living area to dining arrangement, from well-equipped galley to day head, through to the wheelhouse with helm station and companion seating. Below deck, four ensuite cabins sleep eight, supported by crew quarters with two further cabins and a crew mess. The elegant master stateroom, accessed via private stairway from the main deck, makes full use of the yacht's impressive beam.





The flybridge features relaxed seating and dining areas, a large sunpad, fully equipped wetbar with optional stools, plus stowage capacity for a 4m tender or wetbike. Flexibility continues on the flybridge too with two further aft layout options including a relaxed free-standing L-shaped seating arrangement or spa bath with sun loungers aft. The foredeck has been designed to offer a secluded escape to while-away an afternoon or an elegant entertaining space to sip cocktails with guests. A conversationalist seating area can easily accommodate 10 people, which can convert to offer a spacious sunpad.

Introduced in the summer of 2020, this smallest of the Y Class yachts is an object lesson in on board decadence. It uses an Olesinski exterior design that is defined not by flat two-dimensional surfaces but by elegantly sculpted three-dimensional forms.







Though arguably less ostentatious in appearance than other sub-100-foot 'superyachts', it also features full-length windows that echo those on the new Y95 flagship, plus a flybridge that provides the option of an extended hardtop with a stylish louvered roof.



The foredeck sunbathing area can be converted to include forward or aft-facing seats and, while the sociable helm is ideal for owner-operator use, there is also a twin ensuite crew cabin that doubles as an extra guest room. This adds some useful cruising flexibility to the four dedicated ensuite cabins further forward



– and yet the full-beam owner's stateroom still has plenty of room for its own private spiral staircase. Little wonder that this beautiful yacht won the prestigious Motor Boat of the Year Awards in 2022.





restaurants, boutique shops, art galleries and Plymouth Gin Distillery, then across Sutton Harbour lock to the National Marine Aquarium. For culture vultures, the Theatre Royal sets the stage for new West End shows and The Box is an award-winning art gallery, museum and archive.

For 'off-grid' serenity, the southwest is outstanding. The stretch of coastline to Salcombe and Dartmouth is particularly renowned for its epic landscapes and deep-cut estuaries. And in south Cornwall, the coastline to Falmouth, with Looe and Fowey enroute, gives you access to some gorgeous little fishing towns.

Med has to offer. Family-friendly beach festival 'Tunes on the Sands' offers a weekend of live bands and DJs with a relaxed vibe in July. Every cove, every estuary is different. From Plymouth, you can cruise to Hope Cove, Salcombe and Dartmouth to the east in Devon and Cawsand Bay, Fowey, Falmouth and the Helford River to the west in Cornwall. The scenery is unbelievable, there's wildlife everywhere you look and the seafood is as good as you will find. We also have some fabulous events close to home including the Dartmouth Regatta, the Salcombe Regatta, Plymouth Seafood & Harbour Festival, the Falmouth Regatta and the Torbay Air Show.'

Best anchorage:

The River Yealm is a beautiful estuary for a quiet anchorage. Cellar Bay is near the mouth of the river, and further up you can moor up at one of the public pontoons or pick up a mooring buoy. The scenery is stunning. Its tranquillity lends itself to a spot of paddle boarding or kayaking to explore the river. Or you can take the tender up to one of the great pubs such as the Ship Inn – a lovely gastro pub with superb outdoor seating with a Caribbean inspired summer house, or you can stay cosy indoors next to the fire. Across Noss creek is the Swan Inn and across Newton Creek is the Dolphin – and you can use the causeways at low tide to stroll between them. There's also a fabulous circular 90-minute cliff top walk called 'The Warren', if you feel like stretching your legs. It takes in spectacular views across the English Channel and along the rugged Devon coastline and then leads down through the woods beside the river, finishing at the Ship Inn - perfect for a well-deserved lunch.

Best overnight stop:

Salcombe in the summer is absolutely buzzing. This popular nautical town is the jewel in the South Hams, attracting a discerning crowd. It's set on the beautiful Kingsbridge Estuary – a boating mecca for dinghy sailing, yachts, motor boats, paddle boards and kayaks. The picturesque river is flanked with many small golden sandy coves, with lush rolling hills in the background. Salcombe town itself offers a wide selection of boutique shops, deli's, pubs and restaurants, and you can even join a masterclass at the Salcombe Gin Distillery. Take the little foot ferry across to East Portlemouth to walk the South West Coast Path to Gara Rock or take the cute bunting-adorned ferry to South Sands to visit the fabulous South Sands Hotel and Harbour Beach Club Hotel for lunch or dinner right on the beach. Indulge in the spa or walk up to the National Trust's tropical Overbeck's garden - real proof of Salcombe's mild and sunny micro-climate.

Reporting from the 2022 Southampton Boat Show, Motor Boat & Yachting editor Hugo Andreae takes us on a full tour of the Princess F65, which was making its global debut...

Even Princess Yachts themselves weren't sure the new Princess F65 would be finished in time for the Southampton Boat Show but, come the opening day, there it was in all its glory. More than 3ft longer and 3in wider than the Princess F62 it replaces, it's a significant step up in every measure.





The most obvious change is to the exterior, with its sculptured surfacing, more fluid window line and blue accenting. Along with the extra length, it makes for a leaner looking, more balanced profile that will set the tone for all future Princess F-Class models.

It's a theme that carries through to the interior too, where the designers have worked hard to add extra visual interest without losing sight of the deep-seated quality and practical cruising values so loved by Princess owners.

This starts with a softer, more open feel to the saloon, using angled sofas, rounded corners, leather-wrapped grab rails, cross-grained wood on the tables and huge windows without any styling lines to interrupt the view.

Our favourite feature is the cosy corner seat opposite the helm, which has a swing-out laptop table concealed under the dash so you can bang out a few emails or check the weather forecast before sliding it away when you're done.

The big window below is an extra bunk cabin, taking the tally to four – but the

crew cabin is now so spacious that we'd be inclined to call it five. There are now two beds in here with plenty of natural light from the transom window, as well as an ensuite bathroom with a proper separate shower compartment.

It's all fitted out with the same high-quality woodwork as the guest accommodation, so you could happily use it as an overflow cabin without putting anyone's nose out of joint.

The outside entertaining spaces have also moved on, particularly the full-length flybridge with its offset sunbed and twin asymmetric seating areas that feel more welcoming and open than the usual rectangular booths.

However, it's the foredeck sunpads that take the prize for innovation, thanks to folding cushions that can be used to create aft-facing seats or forward-facing headrests, and a refrigerated locker that enables you to grab a cold beer simply by rolling over – bliss!

It all adds up to a very polished, if slightly predictable, offering that fully lives up to its flagship status.








